# BYLAW REMINDERS



It's that time of year to clean up what your pets have left behind in your yard over the winter which may cause odour and visual aesthetic issues for you and your neighbours.

Use the right tools such as rubber gloves, a garbage bag and a pooper scooper. If your dog has been taking care of business on concrete or a patio deck you can consider using an enzyme deodorizer that is meant to digest waste and urine to get your property smelling clean and fresh again. Do not put dog waste in your garden, it does not make good fertilizer! Please see **Animals & Responsible Pet Ownership 1077/AC/2022 section 27** for more information.

The spring thaw brings a plethora of migratory songbirds and an increase in wildlife in town. Review **Wildlife Feeding Bylaw 1073/AC/2021** which reminds us not to over do it with bird feed and no putting out food for deer and squirrels.

The snow has melted and we remind property owners to clean debris and refuse that has accumulated over the winter months. Assess your yard for stagnant water that may support breeding of mosquitoes and other pests, prune and shrubs and trees that may obstruct sidewalks and adjacent properties, and monitor for weeds that grow early in the season. Help give the town a clean sweep for spring. **Community Standards 1047/GEN/2018**

Longer days and warmer temperatures encourage back yard gatherings, construction and home maintenance. All of these activities can cause increased noise outside. Please refer to **Community Standards 1047/GEN/2018 and Fire Bylaw 961/PS/2010** for reminders regarding backyard fires, burning and fireworks.

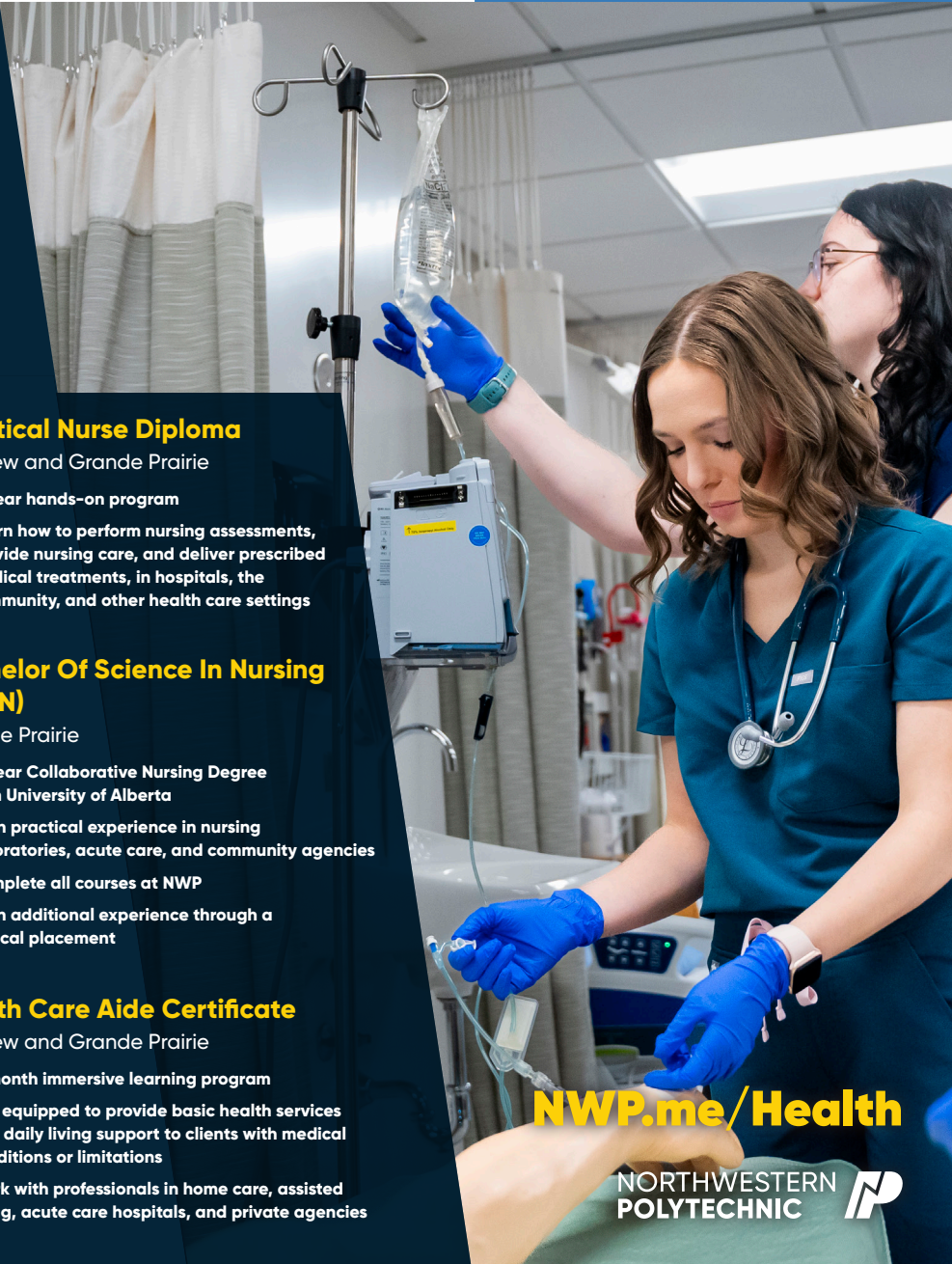
